Subject: Expenditure on Administrative Head and Medical Services including SST by States


ESI Corporation in its 162<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 31.07.2014 decided, on the above subject, to enhance the per capita ceiling from Rs.1500 to Rs.2000 with an additional increase of Rs.150 per IP per year w.e.f. 01.04.2015 for a period of 5 (five) years. The increase on ceiling included the expenditure on super specialty treatment (SST) and other expenditure incurred by SSMC/SMC on behalf of States. The same was conveyed to the State Government vide letter with even No. dated 29.08.2014.

Further, ESI Corporation in its 166<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 07.08.2015 took stock of the difficulties being faced by the beneficiaries and decided that the expenditure on SST would be borne directly henceforth by the ESI Corporation. It was also decided that the ceiling (including SST expenditure) increased from 01.04.2015 may not be rolled back as the same can be utilized for improving the medical services and implementing the new initiatives in the States. However, the annual increase of Rs.150 per IP per year as communicated in ESICs letter dated 29.08.2014 stands withdrawn w.e.f. the financial year 2016-2017 and onwards.

Accordingly, all the SST bills shall be processed and paid by the respective SSMCs/SMCs w.e.f. 01.09.2015, as it was done prior to 31.03.2015. In this connection, it is also clarified that all the SST bills from 01.04.2015 to 31.08.2015 shall be processed and paid by the respective State Governments. Further, the total expenditure on account of Medical and Administrative heads, in the absence of SST expenses with the States, is to be shared in the ratio of 60:40 respectively.

All the State Governments are expected to actively participate and implement the decisions taken by the ESI Corporation for expansion and improvement for providing quality medical care to the ESI beneficiaries.
